What is the Birmingham Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Local Offer?

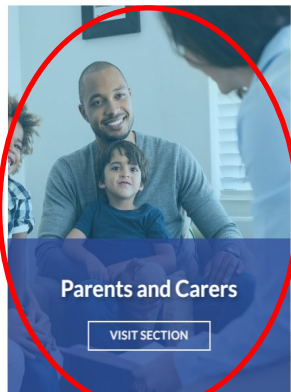
The Local Offer is the range of local agencies including education, health and social care the Local Authority has available to support children and young people with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities and their families. Each Local Authority has a duty to publish this information on a Local Offer Website so that it is all in one place.

Children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities have learning difficulties or disabilities that make it harder for them to learn than most children or young people of the same age. Special educational needs and disabilities fall under four broad areas:

- Communication and interaction (including Autism)
- Cognition and learning
- Social, mental and emotional health
- Sensory and/or physical



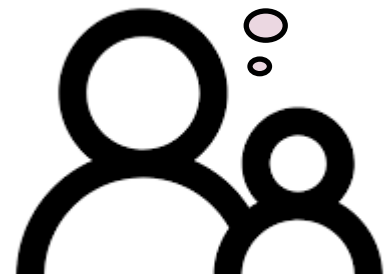
What do I do if I'm worried my child has SEND?

What are Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)?

Where a pupil is identified as having SEN, schools should take action to remove barriers to learning and put effective special educational provision in place. This SEN support should take the form of a four-part cycle known as the graduated approach.

If you feel that your child has Special Educational Needs or a Disability and may need additional help, firstly talk to your health visitor or Special Educational Needs Coordinator at your child's nursery or school, or your GP. You can also call the SEND Parent Link Officers via the Contact Line (0121 303 8461) for more support.

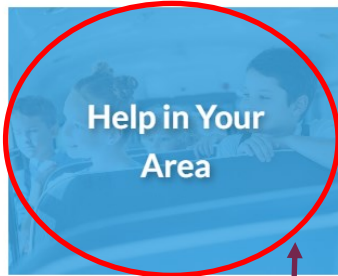
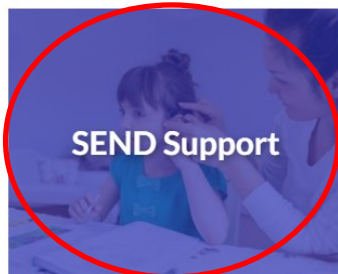
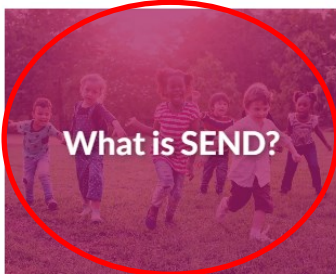
